6. Reports

6.1. Representative Reports

Benicia USD – Steve Phillips reported that Benicia USD has the Amplify ELA curriculum starting for their middle school teachers. This will help special education teachers support more inclusion opportunities, and more transition into the general education classroom.

Fairfield-Suisun USD – Nicole Smith reported on behalf of the Director of Special Education FSUSD. FSUSD held a classified hiring fair and hired sixty-five of the one hundred attendees. They also offered a No Contact Nonviolent Crisis Intervention (NCI) training on October 14, with twenty-five participants. They will be offering CPR/First Aid training for their paraeducators. On November 6, the behaviorists will hold a training for Transitional Academic Program (TAP) paraeducators. FSUSD has also done an audit of their first-year special education teachers to find out what they can do to help support them. Nicole also reported that FSUSD is working to get last month's presenter, "Home Sweet Hygiene," into their elementary Functional Academics (FA) and Transitional Academic Program (TAP) classes.

Travis USD – Kristie Ballard reported that Travis USD was successful in filling more teacher positions, and the teachers will be receiving training from the TUSD special education department. The district is on track for moving its sixth-grade classes to the middle school campus. Kristie highlighted that the Special Education department will offer monthly office hours available to general and special education teachers. They are beginning the planning for their spring Special Olympics.

Vacaville USD – Kerry Pilley-Purcell reported that Vacaville USD will have elementary school conferences next week. They also just held their annual college and careers fair. There were eight hundred attendees.

Solano COE – Pamela Brinkerhoff reported that the Solano COE collaborated with their Clinical Services department, and they will provide a professional development series for their teachers on Trauma Informed Practices. Solano COE provided professional development by their speech providers on how to use AAC systems. They will be providing NCI and CPR training within the next few weeks.

Independent Child Advocate – Dr. Amber Busay reported that her caseload for September was eighty-two, with twenty-three new referrals. She will do two presentations at the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Conference in March 2025. She has been working with Matrix to help support families who need In-Home Health Services (IHSS) support.

6.2 Assistant Superintendent Report – Andrew Ownby presented an update on the Solano County SELPA's latest developments. Andrew highlighted legislation related to special education, CDE compliance improvement monitoring and technical assistance support the SELPA provides its member districts, including professional learning activities.

7. Old Business

ADAPTIVE DRIVING EVALUATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM

- ♦ John Muir Medical Center's outpatient Occupational Therapy Department offers a comprehensive adaptive driving evaluation and training program. The program is designed to determine the specialized needs of the disabled driver and is for anyone who has residual physical, visual, perceptual and/or cognitive deficits.
- The program is served by a registered occupational therapist and a certified driving instructor with extensive background in assessment and rehabilitation of the disabled client. It is certified by the California Department of Rehabilitation.
- ♦ The program is divided into three parts:
 - I. Clinical Evaluation: A 90-minute comprehensive evaluation performed by the occupational therapist, including assessment of visual skills, motor control, strength, reaction time, perceptual skills, and cognitive processes including speed of processing information.
 - **II. Behind the Wheel Assessment:** A thorough 120-minute on-the-road assessment with the occupational therapist and the driving instructor. The assessment determines client's ability or potential to drive safely, further driver training needs, vehicle selection/modification, and adaptive driving equipment needs. This assessment will be completed using the driving instructor's vehicle, which has a passenger side brake.
 - **III. Training:** Following the assessment, additional driver training may be recommended at additional cost. This includes training in compensatory driving techniques and use of an adapted/modified vehicle, if indicated. Duration and frequency of training is based upon individual client's abilities.
- ♦ To participate in the driving program, clients must have a physician's prescription, a valid driver's license or permit, and background medical information would be helpful. The cost of the driving evaluation is \$250 for the clinical evaluation, and \$450 for the behind the wheel assessment. The total is \$700.
